Honouring and Preserving Natural Resources as Sacred Treasures



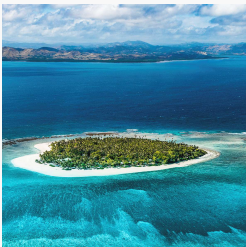
Unique Cultural Significance

Leadership Opportunities

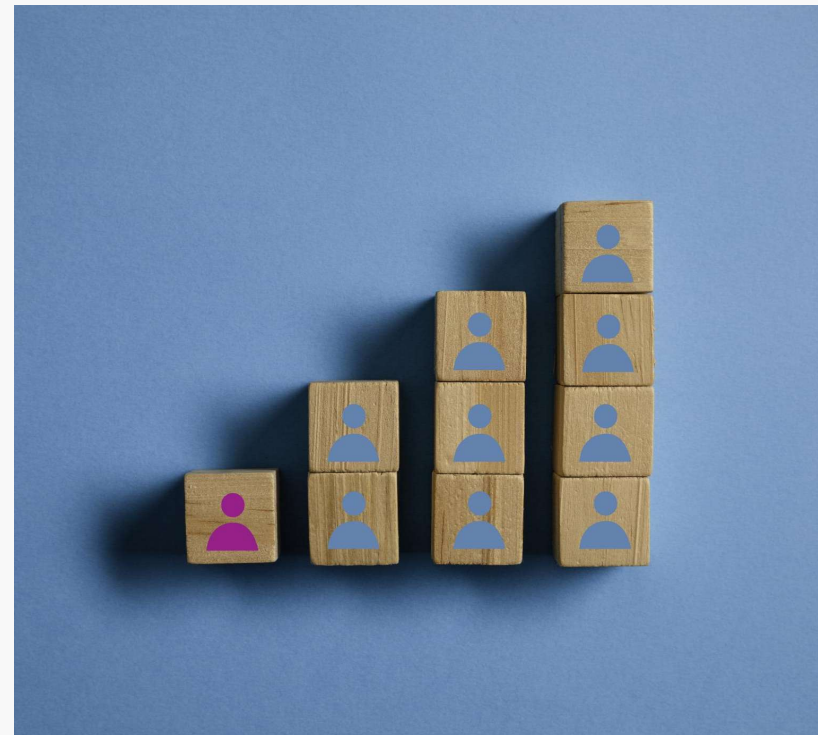
Engaging in asset management cultivates leadership skills essential for managing small or very large investments and teams effectively.

Water Security in Nauru

- Reliance on rainwater collection and truck delivery of desalinated water
- Private boreholes for non-potable use
- High demand for tanker water during droughts
- High operational costs and one of the world's highest water tariffs
- Poor sanitation conditions affects groundwater quality



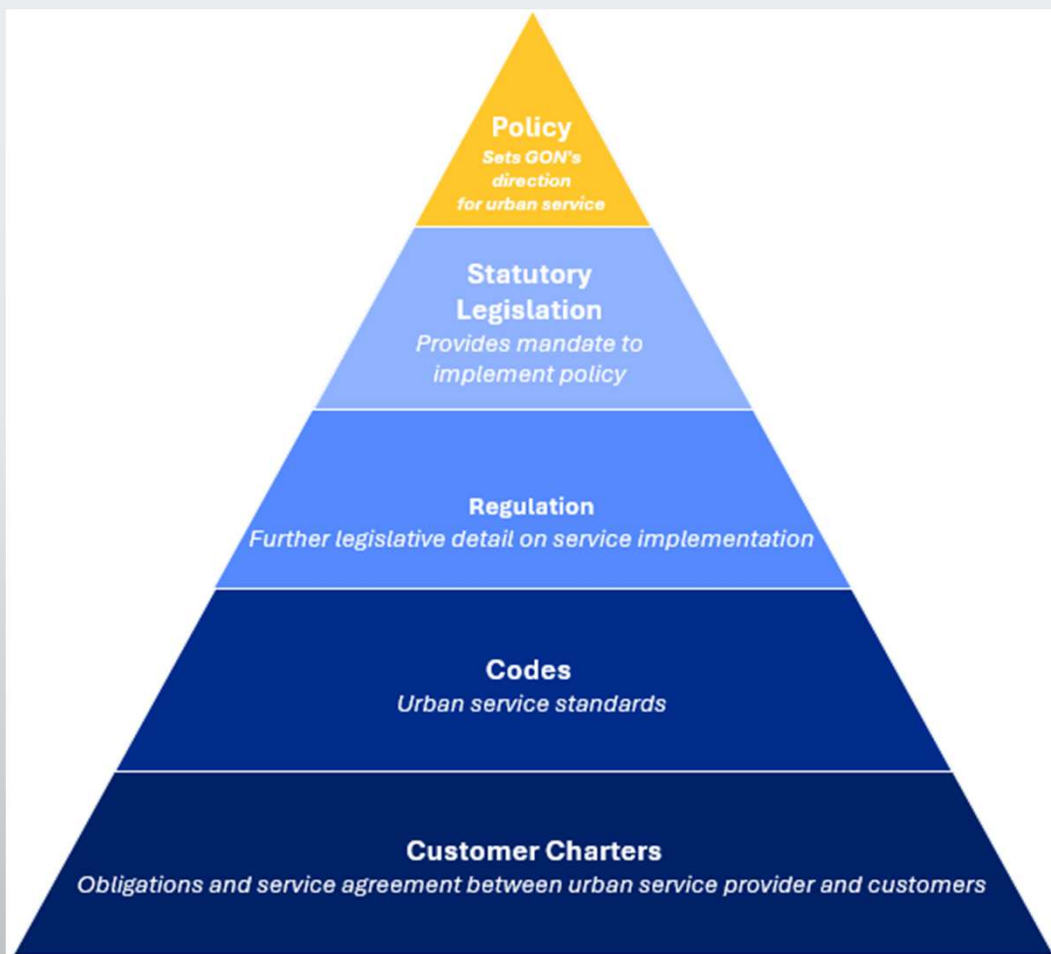
